## It's finally here: Our 50th Anniversary Celebration!

Since last December we have offered several special activities and remembrances to help mark our 50 years in ministry: a kick off celebration; monthly first-Sunday fellowship times; a drone photograph of our congregation; a #50thingsaboutme social media campaign; and a special pledge drive for the *ForwardingFaith* Campaign, which seeks to create a Christian formation endowment in our Virginia Synod. On All Saints Sunday, November 4, 2018, we will offer our pinnacle event – festival worship at 10:45 AM, followed by a meal and program of thanksgiving.

Our guest preacher for the day, **the Rev. Kelly Bayer Derrick**, is a former member of Messiah Lutheran. She presently serves as one of two Assistant Bishops of the Virginia Synod. **Pastor Lou** will preside over the Lord's Supper.

During the day, we will welcome back several former pastors and/or their families. In memory of **the Rev. Larry Matthews** (Pastor at Messiah, 1973-1979), his family has generously donated funds to purchase new brass communion ware. These beautiful items will be dedicated during our worship and used for the first time. A separate large donation was made to MCEF, which was begun during his tenure with the support of Messiah Lutheran, Episcopal Church of the Creator, and Re-

deemer Roman Catholic congregational members.

Of course, we will also recognize all the charter members who first officially organized the church on All Saints Sunday, November 3, 1968. (Messiah began as a mission congregation of the Lutheran Church of America, a predecessor of the ELCA, in 1968.) Yet, we will also look forward to our future filled with hope.

Our day's theme is  
**"50 years...SO what's next?"**

Everyone is welcome! So, please invite friends and family; but, if at all possible, please contact our office with the number of your family and guests attending (if you haven't reported already). This will greatly assist our Fellowship Team as they plan for the meal.

## Messiah & All Saints Day

Through our faith and baptism, we become the adopted children of God, Christ's saints. All Saints Day, November 1 each year, is used by the church to give thanks to God for all saints, whether well-known or not, who have shared their faith, hope and love with us. ## CFFY Corner

(Christian Formation for You)

### MOVIE:

**Greater** (2016): Brandon Burlsworth is perhaps the greatest walk-on in the history of college football. He dreamed of playing for the Arkansas Razorbacks, but was told he wasn't good enough to play Division I ball. Undeterred, Brandon took a risk and walked on in 1994. Written off by fellow teammates and coaches, Brandon displayed dogged determination in the face of staggering odds. The awkward kid, who once was an embarrassment to his teammates and an annoyance to his coaches, ended up becoming the most respected player in the history of the program, changing the lives of all he touched. This movie features themes of persistent hard work, trust, and standing firm in one's faith. It received 5 Dove awards, the highest given and has the faith-friendly seal for ages 12+. It received a 7.2 IMDb rating as well.

### ADULT BOOK:

**The Last Lecture** (2008) is based on the extraordinary final lecture by Carnegie Mellon University professor Randy Pausch. A lot of professors give talks titled "The Last Lecture." Professors are asked to consider their demise and to ruminate on what matters most to them. What wisdom would we impart to the world if we knew it was our last chance? If we had to vanish tomorrow, what would we want as our legacy? When Randy was asked to give such a lecture, he didn't have to imagine it as his last, since he had just recently been diagnosed with terminal cancer. But the lecture he gave—"Really Achieving Your Childhood Dreams"—wasn't about dying. It was about the importance of overcoming obstacles, of enabling the dreams of others, of seizing every moment (because "time is all you have... and you may find

one day that you have less than you think"). It was a summation of everything Randy had come to believe. It was about living. In this book, Randy Pausch has combined the humor, inspiration and intelligence that made his lecture such a phenomenon and gave it an indelible form. It is a book that will be shared for generations to come. It has a Goodreads rating of 4.3 with 269,328 votes.

### YOUTH BOOK:

**Anne of Green Gables** is written by L.M. Montgomery As soon as Anne Shirley arrives at the snug white farmhouse called Green Gables, she is sure she wants to stay forever . . . but will the Cuthberts send her back to the orphanage? Anne knows she's not what they expected—a skinny girl with fiery red hair and a temper to match. If only she can convince them to let her stay, she'll try very hard not to keep rushing headlong into scrapes and blurting out the first thing that comes to her mind. Anne is not like anyone else, the Cuthberts agree; she is special—a girl with an enormous imagination. This orphan girl dreams of the day when she can call herself Anne of Green Gables. It is appropriate for all ages!


