Highlights from Church Council meetings

Messiah Church Council met by conference calls for a special council meeting on 6/29/20 and the regular monthly council meeting on 7/21/20. The following are highlights of the meetings.

Council's special meeting of 6/29/20 was held by conference call to include:

- Allowing small groups to begin meeting at the church with the following protocols in place for the safety and health of all: groups need to register/schedule meetings with church secretary; assign a safety captain responsible for following protocols; designating a cleaning person/team.
- Council will survey congregation for return readiness.
Church will have required postings, written safety/health protocols, cleaning supplies and forms.

Council's regular monthly meeting of 7/21/20 was held by conference call to include:

- The Treasurer's Report shows we were short \$900 for the month of June in expenses over income. It brings our year-to-date income to budget at -\$16,000. This gap continues to grow larger.

- Under Ministry Teams:
 - Christian Formation asked for ideas for Sunday School in the fall if we aren't together yet.
 - The Property Team reported the lawn tractor needed some major repairs that Roger will tackle after mowing season and there were some air conditioning problems we will see if covered under the warranty from last year's service.
 - Social Ministry reported on MCEF's continuing to serve the community.
 - Worship Team said the congregation readiness survey is ready to send out to members this week.
- Old Business: **Pastor Ryan** said that he and his family will be arriving in Richmond, VA on August 7th and staying with a cousin until they find a house. Council said they were happy they will be here among us. We will purchase a new

computer for Pastor's use since the old one needed upgrading that would cost almost as much as a new one.

- New Business: Council reviewed readiness for re-opening – survey ready to go, postings will be printed and posted, supplies are at the church and ready and protocol and forms are ready.

- Council voted to reopen the church for small groups as of 8/1/20. There will be an e-mail informing members of that along with information and forms they will need to use the church. We will see how that goes and results of survey before setting in-person services date.

- Council approved pursuing a church application for the PPP (payroll protection program) offered by the government. This has been encouraged by ELCA for churches to apply for during this time of forced closures.

Pastor's message

Still waiting

But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-14

These words of Paul's were written to an anxious bunch. These were some of the first believers in Jesus as Savior and Lord. These were members of one of the first churches, part of the first spread of the gospel. The good news had spread and radiated out from Jerusalem, from Galilee, farther and farther. And they believed the promises of resurrection and eternal life, the stuff that creeds would one day be made of. It was just a matter of waiting for Jesus to return, like he said he would.

But then... But then people started to die. Jesus wasn't back yet. Persecution and infighting were plaguing the young church. Jesus still wasn't back yet. Arguments about beliefs and practices and doctrines, and whether you had to be Jewish before becoming Christian, or if you were OK to just be a Gentile believer, all of this debate and disagreement swirled around, and Paul was trying to put out the fires with baptismal water... And Jesus had not yet returned. What about the promises? What now?

So Paul wrote these words and others like them, to the churches in Thessalonica and Corinth and more. Reassuring them. Death was not the end, even if you died before the second coming of Christ. Don't grieve like others that have no hope; the promises are as sure as always. Don't fight; strive for unity and peace. God will not forget you or forsake you. God will bring with him those who have died. And

God will hold you in the palm of God's hand now.

Here we are, two thousand years later, give or take. Still waiting. But now we have another level of waiting - four months and counting of quarantine. Some churches have started gathering together again. Some haven't. Some folks feel safe. Some don't. Even when they gather, it's not safe to sing, or pass the plate, or pass the peace. How long do we have to wait? This is the question on a lot of minds, and in a lot of hearts.

The dangers of this pandemic have lasted longer than most anticipated. And it's affected all aspects of life, not just our ability to gather together for worship and other church activities. And we might be wondering when God will do something about this. This can't be what God desires, can it? And, on top of all of that, there is no shortage of disagreement and debate and infighting in our country, our world, and not just over how to handle a pandemic. This can't be what God desires, either, right?

What God desires is that people love God and one another. And so we do that by keeping each other safe and by adapting. What God desires is that we hold tightly to God's promises. And so we remember our baptisms. We hold on to hope so that we don't grieve - or worry - as others do. What God desires is that we trust that God will work goodness even out of these frightening, trying, uncertain times, and that God will use us as instruments of God's goodness in our communities and this world.

We are an anxious bunch; but God's words of promise and hope are written to us and for us, on our hearts, still today. Hang on to hope, and love one another.

CFFY – ELCA Recommended Practices for Lifelong Faith Formation: Guided Learning

Guided Learning happens when we visit and revisit Biblical stories, or hear and share each other's faith stories, with a sense of wonder and discovery. Guided learning is not simply about garnering knowledge, but also about wrestling how to live faithfully each day. As effective as church programming can be, it cannot replace home lives filled with faith conversations, rituals, and service to others. The following are recommended practices for different age groups in the area of Guided Learning.

Children on the Way/Infants:

- Read sacred stories and sing beloved hymns to the child while cuddling, building trust, familiarity with stories, and love for reading and music.
- Join a parent group and/or Bible study group to grow in your parenting skills and your own relationship with God.

Preschool-Kindergarten:

- Attend Sunday School
- Learn about Moses; Adam and Eve; Jonah; Jesus, born of Mary and Joseph; and Jesus' death and resurrection. Familiarity can come through listening to stories or music, whether at home or church.
- Participate in day camps like Vacation Bible School.
- Experience church as a warm, welcoming, worship-filled community where they can wonder about God.

Grades 1-5:

- Retell the basics of core Bible stories in his/her own words (e.g., the creation story, Sarah and Abraham, Moses, Mary Magdalene and Jesus).
- Read bible storybooks and Psalms related to these stories.
- Attend day or overnight church camp (e.g. family camp for 2-4 nights).

Grades 6-8:

- Attend Church Camp
- Come up with his/her own favorite Bible verse
- Know a sacred story that most closely relates to their personal story.
- Learn about available resources (e.g., prayer book, faith website).

Grades 9-12:

- Attend a Bible study with peers or adults.
- Dive deeper into Lutheran theology by learning more about the Reformation.
- Share his/her faith story (written or oral) with a group of peers or the congregation.
- Learn about other Christian denominations and religions and how they compare to the ELCA.

Young Adults:

- Recognize the historical context of the Bible as the inspired word of God.
- Read books related to faith.
- Ask questions and wrestle with his/her faith life in an open/nonjudgmental setting.
- Develop a personalized faith narrative drawn from tradition and reflection that strengthens his/her identity and quality of life.

Middle/Senior Adults:

- Become comfortable with learning and discussing the devotional, literary, historical, and theological dimensions of a biblical passage.

- Seek out movies, videos, and books with religious themes and reflect on how those relate to their own personal belief system.
- Model openness to learning, especially during times of transition, by hearing all sides and supporting the church's mission.
- Show familiarity with the lectionary, Creation, Exodus, the prophets, Psalms, Jesus' Life, the early church, the Reformation, and salvation as a gift from God.
